To place an order online, download the <u>flexischools</u> app and fill in your details.




Birthdays

Greek Language Program

- In 2024 the Greek Community Language Program entered its 29th year.
- Approximately 20% of the school's population is of Greek background.
- The program is offered to all students from Years K-6. (K-1 all students, Years 2-6 elective)

Greek Language Program

- Teachers receive two hours release from face-to-face teaching each week.
- •In Kindergarten, the RFF teachers will be teaching the Greek language program (CLOTE).
- •The Greek teachers are Mrs Moutevelis and Mrs Themistocleous.

- Mrs Moutevelis teaching KP and KR.




Phonological Awareness

Phonological awareness is a crucial skill to develop in children. It is strongly linked to early reading and spelling success through its association with phonics. It is a focus of literacy teaching incorporating:

- recognising phonological patterns such as rhyme and alliteration
- awareness of syllables and phonemes within words, and
- hearing multiple phonemes within words.

Synthetic Phonics



- Synthetic Phonics is an approach to reading and spelling. It means using the phonemes (sounds) to understand how to read and spell.
- Reading involves breaking words into separate sounds (phonemes) that can be blended together.
- Spelling requires students to identify all the phonemes in a word, and then use their knowledge of the alphabetic code to write it.

Synthetic Phonics

Toolkit 1

- There are <u>6 units</u> covered from <u>Toolkit 1</u> in Kindergarten
- Each unit contains a set of phonemes (sounds) and camera words (high frequency words)

Example of unit 1

Phonemes: a m s i p t n d (The students will practise sounding out each phoneme first, then blend them together as part of the reading process.)

Camera words: I the to was are she

Sentences: The man is sad.

Camera Words (Sight words)



Most words in the English language are decodable but there are some irregular, high frequency words. As we want to get children reading simple texts and writing simple sentences quickly we teach those irregular, high frequency words which are tricky but so essential for progression.

We call these words, 'camera words' because children must learn them as though they were taking a photo of the word with their 'mind's eye'. They are encouraged to memorise the word.

It is important to remember that very few words need to be learned by sight and that eventually they will be decodable.
